First Reading

Acts 17:22-31

Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, "Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. ²³For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. ²⁴The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, ²⁵nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. ²⁶From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where

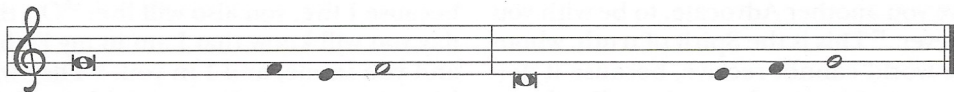
they would live, ²⁷so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. ²⁸For 'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said,

'For we too are his offspring.'

²⁹Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. ³⁰While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, ³¹because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead."

Second Reading

1 Peter 3:13-22

Who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? ¹⁴But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, ¹⁵but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; ¹⁶yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. ¹⁷For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. ¹⁸For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the un-

righteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, ¹⁹in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, ²⁰who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. ²¹And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²²who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

[Jesus said to the disciples:] “If you love me, you will keep my commandments. ¹⁶And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. ¹⁷This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you.

¹⁸“I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you. ¹⁹In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live. ²⁰On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. ²¹They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me; and those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them.”

Guidelines for Attending Church

That is a weird title. Do any of our members not know how to attend church? And yet we will have to do things much differently than we did our last worship on March 15.

1. **If you do not feel comfortable being around people or coming to church – please stay home.**

Yes, you need to wear a mask.

This is a requirement sent to us by our insurance company.

We are planning to share the worship on Facebook also.

2. **Stay 6 feet apart from non-family members. Please begin filling the church from front to back**, as we will dismiss from back to front in order to prevent people from passing by people sitting on the end of the pews.

USE HAND SANITIZER AS YOU ARE ENTERING AND LEAVING THE CHURCH

We will not be singing or using the hymnals.

- a. **Space yourself in the pews so as not to sit next to, behind, in front of anyone less than 6 feet. Family members may sit together. Two pews separation should do the trick. Council has pews taped off as guidelines.**
- b. **When entering the church pick up your own bulletin and communion card. There will be a plate to place your communion card in when you leave the church.**
- c. **There will be a plate available for offerings on the table with the bulletins. No offering will be collected.**

- d. Do not linger in the church to visit – please exit the west doors and do not stand blocking the exit. The weather should be nice enough to visit (with your masks on) and keep social distancing on the lawn following worship. There will not be fellowship in the church basement for the time being.
3. No touching. Wave or nod your head as you say good morning or when you pass the peace.
 4. Communion will be done with wafer and juice communion sets when they become available. Pick a set up when you pick up your bulletin. They will be in a baggie for disposal into trash cans at the back of the church to dispose of on your way out. This will hopefully keep grape juice droplets from staining the pew cushions. Little boxes of raisins will be available for the children. Congregation members will not come forward to receive communion. Pastor will direct congregation when to open their communion set and we will receive together. There will be a learning curve to discover the best way to do this for each congregation. These communion sets are on back order and will not be shipped before May 15.
 5. Pastor will probably not greet you as you leave but will be outside to visit, with social distancing.
 6. You may not be able to sit in “your” pew. This will feel uncomfortable. Pastor and Church Council don’t like it either, but we must worship safely so we can live to serve God.
