## **Guidelines for Attending Church**

That is a weird title. Do any of our members not know how to attend church? And yet we will have to do things much differently than we did our last worship on March 15. I will list the changes in no particular order.

1. If you do not feel comfortable being around people or coming to church – please stay home.  
We are planning to share the worship on Facebook also.
2. Stay 6 feet apart from non-family members. Please begin filling the church from front to back, as we will dismiss from back to front in order to prevent people from passing by people sitting on the end of the pews.
  - a. Space yourself in the pews so as not to sit next to, behind, in front of anyone less than 6 feet. Family members may sit together. Two pews separation should do the trick. Grace Lutheran will have pews taped off as guidelines.
  - b. When entering the church pick up your own bulletin and communion card. There will be a plate to place your communion card in when you leave the church.
  - c. There will be a plate available for offerings on the table with the bulletins.
  - d. Do not linger in the church to visit. The weather should be nice enough to visit and keep social distancing on the lawn following worship. There will not be fellowship in the church basement for the time being at Grace Lutheran.
3. No touching. Wave or nod your head as you say good morning or when you pass the peace.
4. Communion will be done with wafer and juice communion sets. Pick a set up when you pick up your bulletin. They will be in a baggie for disposal into trash cans at the back of the church and SE office, to dispose of on your way out. This will hopefully keep grape juice droplets from staining the pew cushions. Little boxes of raisins will be available for the children. Congregation members will not come forward to receive communion. Pastor will direct congregation when to open their communion set and we will receive together. There will be a learning curve to discover the best way to do this for each congregation. These communion sets are on back order and will not be shipped before May 15.
5. Pastor will probably not greet you as you leave but will be outside to visit, with social distancing.
6. Yes, you may wear a mask. You may not be able to sit in “your” pew. This will feel uncomfortable. Pastor and Church Council don't like it either, but we must worship safely so we can live to serve God.

## Grace Lutheran Church Council 21 April 2020

Grace Lutheran Church Council met 21 April 2020. The meeting was called to order by Paul Wilken. Pastor Jim Helgren started the meeting with a prayer. Council members present were: Paul Wilken, Amber Beard, Richard Roesener, Robin Eggleston, Caleb Eggleston, and Gene Ekhoff. Also in attendance were Pastor Jim Helgren & Diane Wilken

Richard Roesener made a motion to accept the minutes of the March 2020 meeting. Gene Ekhoff seconded. Motion carried.

The financial report was reviewed. The account balances as of 31 March 2020 are:

Current: \$8,715.24	Memorial: \$13,853.68
Improvement: \$7,366.21	Luther League: \$4,163.74

Small Business Loan did not go through on the first funding, but will be resubmitted after additional funds are available. Nothing has been heard from FEMA request. Richard Roesener made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Gene Ekhoff seconded. Motion carried.

### Pastor Helgren's Monthly Report:

Pastor Helgren provided services through Facebook. The service will be pre-recorded. Ringing of the bell was requested and will occur for the recordings.

Kids for Christ has been going live weekly on Facebook as well, and well received! Over 100 participants logged in to see the program.

Blankets have been set up to tie in the basement. Several members have come to participate.

Holy week decorations were aesthetically pleasing and well received by the members. This was graciously donated, in time and money.

Concerns were raised about songs' licenses being broadcasted during the pandemic. CCLI offers licensure to cover apprehensions. According to our attendance, the church would have to pay just over \$100 annually. Gene Ekhoff made a motion to pay for the licensing to make sure we are covered. Richard Roesener seconded. Motion carried.

Communion was discussed. A prepackaged option with grape juice and the wafer, with several alternatives available at different price points. Robin Eggleston made a motion to purchase some for a trial when we are able to present/accept communion again. Richard Roesener seconded. Motion carried.

Indian Oaks donations that were to be received as Lenten offering will still occur, but will accrue accordingly as the pandemic subsides.

Painting, window repair, flashing – painting of the repaired bell tower looks excellent; windows need some repair on the east & west sides which includes vinyl sill on one window, caulking, and painting (painting is an additional \$125) around windows on east side of church. Grace Lutheran Church Council met 11 April 2020.

The meeting was called to order by Paul Wilken. Pastor Jim Helgren started the meeting with a prayer. Council members present were: Paul Wilken, Amber Beard, Richard Roesener, Robin Eggleston, and Gene Ekhoff. Also in attendance was Jim Helgren and Diane Wilken. Absent Caleb Eggleston.

Meeting was called together to discuss the Small Business Administration Grant/Funding and FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) to assist during the fiscal hardships due to the COVID Pandemic. This money will permit emergency funds to be used to fulfill the duties necessary to run the church, reallocating for staffing costs. A Local Disaster Declaration was created to request these necessary funds for the expenditure of emergency funds from all available sources, the invoking of the mutual aid agreements. A motion was made by Robin Eggleston to appoint Diane Wilken as the agent to authorize these funds for Grace Lutheran Church. Amber Beard seconded and motion was approved.

The progress of the balcony wall was discussed with enthusiasm. The results have been exemplary thus far.
