From the Pastor,





PIECEMAKERS

The Piecemakers meet every Tuesday during the months of January, February and March - all day. And you are welcome to join them if you feel safe doing so. Since there are no activities going on at church at this time, you are welcome to come at any time you wish to tie blankets. There are usually 3-4 blankets in frames ready to tie, and Rich and Joyce come to check if they need to roll the blankets or put one in the frame. Please come and join in the fellowship of making some beautiful warm blankets for those in need.



At the 2021 Annual Meeting Paul Wilken asked about the total quilts made by the Piecemakers. That got me to thinking about the project. So I looked back on the records that we have. The records that we have date back to 1990, with 1992 numbers missing. The banner year for Piecemakers was 2010 having completed 614 blankets. 2000 had the least blankets, 200 made that year. The average number is 370 over these years. There were 8 years in the 400's, 11 years with 200's, 6 years in 300's and 4 years (including 2020) with totals in the 500's. We only had one year—2010 with an amount over 600. That makes a total of 11,112 blankets that we have recorded being made.

In the nineties there were approximately 29 ladies attending the blanket making days to help. Back in those days the quilt tops and backs were sewn together at church. Now we just tie the blankets with the tops and backs put together at someone's home. On a good day the last few years we have had 10—12 ladies help tie the blankets.


