



## From the Pastor,

February 17 was Ash Wednesday. The eighth grade confirmation class met from 6:00—6:30 p.m. The week before I had highly suggested the youth staying for Ash Wednesday worship, but did not require their attendance. All three students stayed for the worship service.

After class I went about getting ready for worship. I came downstairs at one point and the three students were hanging out. Two were talking to each other and one was on his phone not participating in their conversation.

The Grace Lutheran female student looked at me with sass in her eyes and said something like they were talking and we didn't need a pastor tonight because the two of them could lead worship. I am not sure what reaction they expecting from me, but they were surprised by my reaction. I remarked that it was great that they thought so and I was looking for volunteers to train to lead worship (see "Worship Leader").

The third youth immediately looked up from his phone and said I am not part of this. He then explained how challenging it was for him to read a speech in front of people. The Holy Spirit gives all of us different gifts. Public speaking was not his gift, but he did light the candles before church began utilizing an ability the Holy Spirit did gift him.

I hope my Grace Lutheran and Hope Lutheran Church students will strongly consider "replacing me". Let us use Lent, 2021 to do the disciplines of Lent, but also focus on discovery or rediscovering the gifts given to us by the Holy Spirit and finding ways to use them.

### Worship Leader

One thing I learned from my experience with Covid-19 is that neither congregation is prepared for worship on a Sunday that I may not be able to attend at the last minute.

To resolve this issue I would like to train at least one member of each church to be able to lead worship. Preaching is optional, but I am hoping to find members willing to be available to lead the congregation through a Lutheran Book of Worship or With One Voice liturgy. Please contact me if you are willing to at least consider it. I will help train anyone who is open to at least see if the Holy Spirit has given them worship leader gifts. Some qualities needed are a respect for worship and the liturgy, the ability to speak in front of others, and love of God and the congregation.

### Synod Ambassadors

The Nebraska Synod is attempting to address the more than 1,000 open calls for full-time pastors in the ELCA.

One way is to seek Synod Ambassadors in each congregation. One role of an Ambassador is for connecting people in the congregation to what's going on in the larger church about trainings and events that the Synod and ELCA offers. Another role is inviting people in the congregation to discern their vocation - or God's call - in their lives.

Congregations may have a connector and an inviter, or one person could do both functions. Synod will provide training for Synod Ambassadors. Please see Pastor for more information.

Snow Removal -Thank you to all who have helped clear the snowy sidewalks this year. Thank you!



It was decided at the 2021 Annual Meeting to replace most of the sidewalks on the south side of the church, the sidewalk coming out from the front door of the parsonage and repair the patio at the parsonage. We are seeking bids but with the weather we have only received one thus far with a total cost of \$11,823. We would like to have this project completed as soon as possible this spring. We are afraid if we put off the contractors, who knows when it can be done. This will also include members of the church doing some of the work, by removing the old sidewalks (we have someone that will take the old concrete) and then backfilling the dirt along the new sidewalk, and reseeding.
