From the Pastor,

We had COVID in January. We had COVID reaction to the vaccine February 12-13 and March 12-13. We had the stomach flu April 12-13. I tested negative for COVID. I am writing this May 12 and waiting for illness to strike.

On youngest was in Serbia for three weeks in March. We had 2 dogs and a cat to care for. My two cats had to stay in the back part of the house. My son's animals all require special treatment for health issues and must eat according to a schedule.

My oldest is in the Army Reserve and his medical unit is now serving in Kuwait.

We have been in the planning stages for moving my sister to Cook. That will finally happen May 23. Stress about the move has lessened every time a detail falls into place. Still, every night in my head I am making the drive from Milwaukee to Cook.

The one thing that has helped us in our stress is prayer. Prayer for help with each issue. Prayer of thanks every time something goes right. Prayer just for the sake of prayer. Don't forget to invite God into your stress.

Trusting God requires believing God is with you. Prayer reminds one that God is present with you. Prayer reminds us that there are a lot of things out of our control, but not necessarily out of God's control.

Be God-centered and give some of your stress to God. Some stress can be helpful to help inspire us to do what we can. Too much stress can harm us mentally, physically, emotionally, and even spiritually. Pray and give God all or most of your stress.

Emanuel Nine, martyrs, 2015

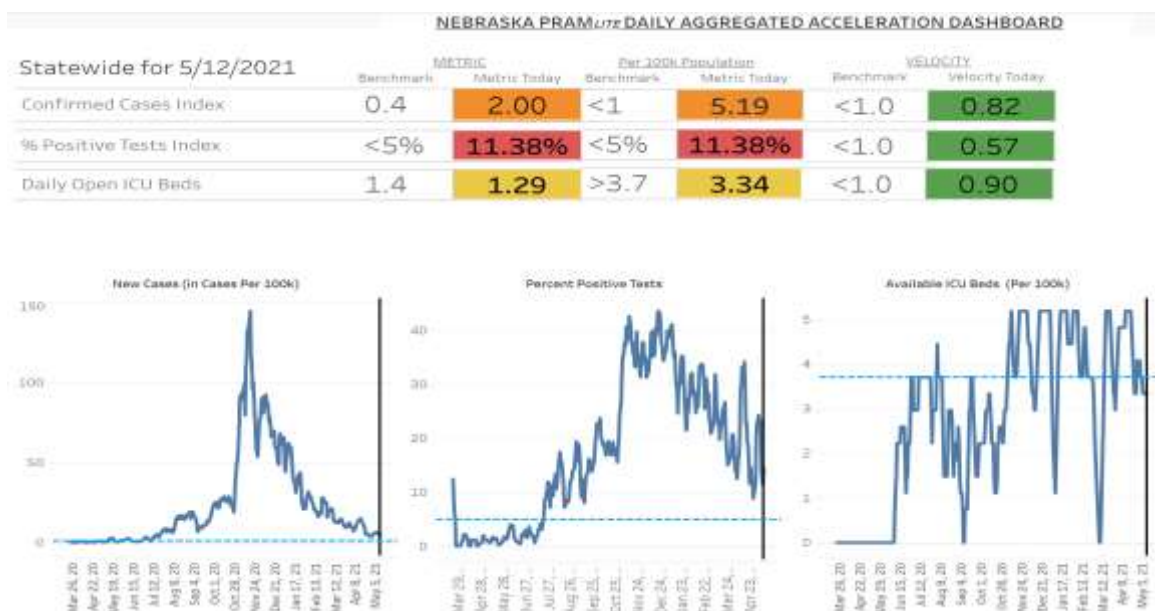
On June 17, 2015, Clementa C. Pinckney, Cynthia Marie Graham Hurd, Susie Jackson, Ethel Lee Lance, DePayne Middleton-Doctor, Tywanza Sanders, Daniel Lee Simmons, Sharonda Coleman-Singleton, and Myra Thompson were murdered by a self-professed white supremacist while they were gathered for Bible Study and prayer at the Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church (often referred to as Mother Emanuel) in Charleston, South Carolina. Pastors Pinckney and Simmons were both graduates of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary. A resolution to commemorate June 17 as a day of repentance for the martyrdom of the Emanuel Nine was adopted by the Churchwide Assembly of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on August 8, 2019. Congregations of the ELCA are encouraged to reaffirm their commitment to repenting of the sins of racism and white supremacy which continue to plague this church, to venerate the martyrdom of the Emanuel Nine, and to mark this day of penitence with study and prayer.

We wanted to update you on our process for evaluating Grace Lutheran's COVID-19 guidelines. At this time, we are not lifting the requirement to wear masks while at church services, and we wanted to explain the reasoning behind that decision.

At each Council meeting since March 2020, the Council has evaluated this situation. We've sought guidance from a range of sources, primarily: The ELCA and Nebraska Synod, our liability insurer, the CDC, the State of Nebraska's directed health measures and recommendations, University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC), and the recommendations of our local health department. We will continue to look at these sources as time moves on.

On May 13, 2021, the metrics from UNMC indicated that conditions in our health district were certainly moving in the right direction. However, depending on which metric you look at, we are still in either the yellow, orange, or red categories.



The CDC announced on May 13<sup>th</sup> (the same day as our May council meeting) that “fully vaccinated people can resume activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing,” except for certain situations including where required by law, a local business, or an employer. According to the CDC, people are generally considered to be fully vaccinated:

2 weeks after the second dose in a 2-dose series (e.g., Pfizer or Moderna vaccines), or

2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine (e.g., Johnson & Johnson vaccine)

If you don't meet these requirements, regardless of your age, you are NOT fully vaccinated.

So, the question at this point is when should we lift our mask requirement for church services? Right now, we don't know. We know that nearly EVERYONE (even the people who have been in support of the mask mandates) would like to not wear masks anymore. We would all like to see each other's smiling faces again unimpeded by a mask.

Based on the information that came out yesterday from the CDC, we need to seek information from our liability insurer, the ELCA, the Nebraska Synod, and the Southeast Nebraska District Health Department. For example, we are trying to learn information about the vaccination rate in our health district and, to the extent possible, Johnson County. We also want to ensure that our liability carrier agrees with a decision to lift the mask mandate for vaccinated individuals.

Finally, we want to ensure that everyone who wants to be vaccinated and/or has just recently been vaccinated has time for their shots to become fully effective prior to lifting the mandate for vaccinated individuals. We expect that the CDC's announcement may encourage some people who have been hesitant to get vaccinated to do so.

We will be back in touch after next month's council meeting with more information.

In addition we will collect for the Dewitt food pantry and their needs include paper products, toilet paper, paper towels, diapers, toothpaste, feminine hygiene products, peanut butter, cereal, pancake mix macaroni and cheese, and other nonperishable foods. We will also have an opportunity to help the University of Nebraska Lutheran center by bringing monetary donations for them to use as they get their new facility up and serving our young people. If you can't attend but would like to contribute to the Spring Gathering causes please leave items in the back of our church or see Joyce or Eleta with ear marked money donations.

An idea has been shared and will be discussed about eliminating a nominating committee and having volunteer churches offer to have Spring Gatherings and to have them involve close neighboring churches to plan and carry out the Gathering program. The idea is to cut down on travel time for planning committee members, to give smaller church women's groups more of a chance to participate, and to avoid the nominating committee job that no one seems to want.

An evening meal which is included in your registration fee is to be served about 7:00 and ladies will return home after they have shared food and fellowship. It has been a long while since we have had a fellowship opportunity with fellow Lutheran ladies so it is hoped that we can have a good representation attending from Grace Lutheran. **13 May 2021**

Grace Lutheran Church Council met 13 May 2021. The meeting was called to order by Paul Wilken. Pastor Jim Helgren started the meeting with a prayer. Council members present were: Paul Wilken, Amber Beard, Bret Wellensiek, and Kate Dietz. Also in attendance were Pastor Jim Helgren and Diane Wilken, church secretary/treasurer. Absent Erin Ebeler Rolf and Mitchell Brinkman.

Bret Wellensiek made a motion to accept the minutes of the 16 March 2021 meeting. Kate Dietz seconded. Motion carried.

The financial report was reviewed. Kate Dietz made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Bret Wellensiek seconded. Motion carried.

### **Pastor Helgren's Monthly Report:**

**Sidewalk update :** We have received \$9,000 toward a goal of \$12,750 to replace some of the sidewalks at church and at the parsonage.
