Are You Up for a Challenge?

Anyone who sews, the Piecemakers are inviting you to join them in a service project. The family of Adeline Moss has given our group a quantity of nice fabric. To express appreciation we are launching a project to make lap blankets for the Care Center in Adams, Gold Crest, where she is currently a resident. Many of the pieces of donated fabrics are in fat quarters (18" by 18") or half yard pieces. If you cut these pieces in 9" squares you can make a lap blanket top by constructing a rectangle of blocks 4 by 6 or composed of 24 blocks. This is only a suggestion for achieving the approximate size (larger than 30 by 36). If you wish to make lap blankets and you have your own fabric that would also be great. If this project interests you, you can come to the church basement and choose the fabric that pleases you to take to make your top or tops. Each fat quarter cuts 4 blocks and each half yard will cut 8. We would like these tops returned to the church by January 25th. That will allow the Piecemakers a couple of weeks to tie and bind and be able to make a projected Valentine delivery.

This is a project that could help you chase the winter doldrums away and in turn be special for someone else. Please join us and let's see what Grace Lutheran can accomplish. A good number of blankets could insure other neighboring facilities a chance to receive some of these blankets created with our love.

Next Meeting will be November 16, 2021, at 7PM


Meeting was adjourned by Paul Wilken and the meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
