First Reading

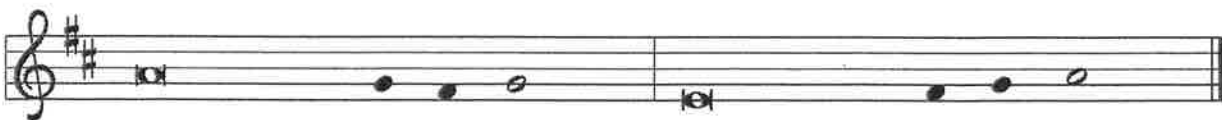
Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

am I? Your own nation and the chief
priests have handed you over to me.
What have you done?" ³⁶Jesus an-
swered, "My kingdom is not from this
world. If my kingdom were from this

world, my followers would be fighting
to keep me from being handed over
to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom
is not from here." ³⁷Pilate asked him,
"So you are a king?" Jesus answered,
"You say that I am a king. For this I
