Annual Meeting Minutes

January 16, 2022

The Grace Lutheran Church Annual Meeting was called to order by Council President Paul Wilken on Sunday, January 16, 2022, following the worship service. There were 30 members signed in at the meeting. Pastor Jim Helgren began the meeting with a prayer.

A motion was made by Diane Ekhoﬀ and seconded by Robin Eggleston to approve the minutes as printed from the January 17, 2021 Annual Meeting. Motion carried.

The Pastor's Report was reviewed. Pastor discussed he is still learning how to use the Communion wafer dispenser that he is now using.

Council President Paul Wilken reviewed the reports and opened each one for discussion.

Discussion on committee reports was provided, as follows:

The Property Committee Report for 2021 was presented by Bret Wellensiek. It was noted by Paul Wilken that the replacement of sidewalks at the church & parsonage was rebid (due to current higher prices) to increase the original bid by approximately \$765.

The Women's Stewardship Report was created by the Secretary of Stewardship, Joyce Roesener. This year, 2021 a new record 654 quilts were created. A round of applause to all those who helped create those blankets for this worthwhile project.

Auditor's Report was completed by Jody Bruns and the books were found to be well organized and in good order.

The congregation was updated on the recent Cluster meeting held with Synod representative Megan Morrow. Combining local churches with closures and declining memberships was discussed. There will be another meeting on February 13 with Hope, Grace, Faith and St. Matthews for further discussion. The Council will talk about asking for volunteers to make a committee for this.

Council Members Paul Wilken, and Amber Beard completed their terms on the Church Council. Discussion ensued as to how many Church Council Members were needed for 2022. Julie Effken made a motion to maintain the council of five (5) members, with the understanding that there will be one (1) high school member in attendance. Kathy Helgren seconded. Motion carried.

Amber Beard consented to serve for another 2-year term. Nominations were opened for the other two-year term left available on the Church Council. Carl Purcell and Robin Eggleston were nominated from the floor but declined at this time. Council members will contact other congregational members who were suggested to see if they would be willing to serve. Youth Council Member will be Tucker Drake.

Coverage for Worship duty was discussed – members suggested in past years to help cover to keep the number of Council Members down to 5 from 9. It was suggested to call members and offer 1 or 2 weeks to cover worship duties.

Eleta Eisenhower and Dean Wellensiek were nominated and accepted to attend the Nebraska Synod Assembly June 2-4. This will include a cluster meeting on February 5 to nominate candidates for a new Nebraska Bishop to be elected at the Synod Convention. Motion carried to accept them as delegates.

Richard and Joyce Roesener agreed to be financial secretaries again.

Lisa and Nick Weber, and Melissa Wellensiek volunteered to continue serving through their leadership of the Sunday School Program, as they do an exceptional job in that role.

Council President Paul Wilken opened the discussion about the letter received from Bishop Maas on the upcoming celebration of the Nebraska Synod 150th Anniversary. The Synod is inviting all churches to help raise \$150,000 to use for 3 Ministries supported by the Nebraska Synod - Mission Field Nebraska, Nebraska Leadership & training and Congregational Resources. It was suggested to either collect designated offerings from the congregation or to give a specific amount from the Grace Lutheran general fund. Dean Wellensiek made a motion to send \$500 from the general fund. Sarah Purcell seconded. Motion carried.

Members of the Grace Luther League will be attending the ELCA Youth Gathering in Minneapolis, MN, July 24-28, and will be collecting donations today at the Soup Luncheon.

It was decided to create a committee to start planning for the 75th Anniversary in 2024. If anyone is interested, please contact a council member.

The 2022 Proposed Budget was reviewed and opened for discussion. Diane Ekhoft motioned to accept the 2022 budget as presented. Richard Roesener seconded. Motion carried.

The 2022 Church Council will have a quick reorganizational meeting being held promptly following the annual meeting.

The meeting concluded with the Lord's Prayer. Members were again invited to join in the basement for the Luther League Soup Luncheon. The meeting was then adjourned, and the reorganizational meeting commenced.

Sidewalk project – the bid increased about \$700 and is re-scheduled for April.

Parsonage Window – waiting for the replacement to be installed

Snow Removal – Bret and Hayden Wellensiek scooped the sidewalks and are willing to keep doing this.

Warthog did the parking lot at the beginning of the month.

Worship, Evangelism, Music, and Fellowship – Erin Ebeler Rolf
