To complicate things our lives, Saddie the center of our universe has been diagnosed with diabetes on September 8th. She received insulin shots every twelve hours. Our family schedule will now be determined around trying to keep her alive and well. Plans I was making for our anniversary next month were changed to accommodate the center of our family universe, (Written 9/13).

Today, September 15, my cat Saddie died. We put her to sleep because she was not adjusting well to her diabetic treatment. Her quality of life was quickly digressing. But just because she is gone doesn't mean she will no longer be the center of our family universe. The other two cats do not yet understand that she is no longer with us and not just hiding under the bed until it is time to remind everybody who is in charge and the true center of the center of the household universe is.

The truth is Saddie was not the center of our family universe. God was and is. Our love for our cats and children and each other came from the center of our lives both separate and complete. God's love for us in Jesus Christ informed our love for God which then extended to ourselves and our family. Love for cats or family that is not God-centered will be an unhealthy love for cats and family. Try explaining that young children or cats. One can't. One can only struggle to keep Jesus at the center of one's life and universe no matter how noble or demanding your cat may be.

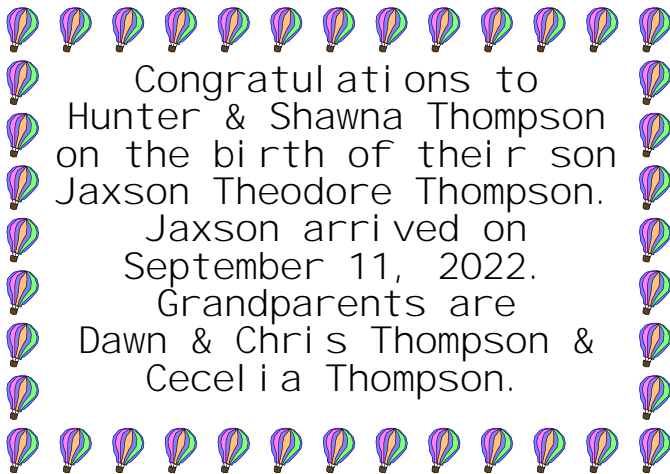
Walkers of all ages are invited. Any distance can be walked and the "water wagon" will be traveling along the road and will take walkers to the end point.

“Kids for Christ”

Is on its way back!

Kids for Christ has been and will continue to be an afterschool program for ALL school age kids, hosted by Grace Lutheran Church with additional support from friends at Osage Church. Students older than 6th grade are invited to be kitchen helpers, cooking and serving the evening meal. (Kitchen helpers, here is an opportunity for community service.)

Plan for some changes. The first change being in the meeting time. We will meet right after school on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month as long as there is school that day. We will continue with the format of a cookie snack upon arrival for the children, a short devotion, a picture book story, a craft, some singing, prayer and a shared evening meal. We will have students ready for pick up or to go home between 5:30 and 5:45. Expect to see some new faces in the adult helpers. Because our students have continued to have birthdays and have moved on up the grades at school we will see new faces too. Invite your friends and plan to come!

Leaders will be Sarah Purcell and Eleta Eisenhauer, and head kitchen Cooks will be Carl Purcell and Andrea Eggleston, pastor Jim Helgren will be there too! We welcome additional helpers from the community. If you have a craft to share, something that could be developed into a 15 minute program, an interesting hobby, talent, or food in quantity to share please contact one of these people and you will be welcomed into a time slot! Working with children can be a very rewarding Christian experience. You do not need to commit to every time, occasional help as it works in your schedule is always welcome.

Our goal is to teach children that there is a God and that he loves them. Those of us who love God also want to share some of the basic expectations of a Christian. We look forward to meeting the community children and sharing God's love with them!

Southeast Nebraska ladies of the ELCA,

You have been a vital part of making our “Saved to Serve” and Prison Ministry Kitchen Kit Projects such a success. Thank You doesn't seem adequate.

At Lodge Pole we were able to assemble 27 quilts for refugees and Lutheran World Relief. Some of you sent blocks which were sewed into tops and some of you sent completed tops as well as sheets of various kinds for middles and or backs.

Linda Eisenhauer's family contributed many yards of her quilting stash in her memory for us to use as backs for these quilts. It is so nice to have new fabric which somewhat coordinates with the top for these blankets. It seems to be the finishing touch. Linda was an active member at Hope in Burr.

We were able to assemble 25 prison ministry kits that included a 12 quart tote, 3 dish towels, 2 potholders, a mitt, measuring cups, measuring spoons, 2 rubber scrapers, spatulas, either or various other items to include paring knives, kitchen knives, pizza cutters, silverware for 2, a glass dish or glass, Scotch Brite type items, dish soap, recipe books, wash cloths, can openers, kitchen scissors, bag clips, wooden utensils, whisks, tongs, large forks, cutting pads, steak knives and even a few place mats. Other and extra items were sent along to Bridges of Hope to dispense as they saw fit.

At Lodge Pole we did a leftover Bible School project. We make little globes using ping pong balls and after they were painted we slipped them over battery operated tea light candles to serve as a reminder to be a light in the world. Like us one little light doesn't do much in the darkness but all of our lights together made quite a glow. Yes ladies, working together on these projects we have made quite a GLOW! Thank You!!!

The Kitchen Kits have been delivered to Bridges for Hope and 10 of the blankets were sent to Lutheran World Relief and 17 were sent to the Refugee director at Lutheran Family and Social Services in Omaha for distribution. He came and visited (educated) us. We were made aware of some of the needs of Afghanistan and Ukrainian refugees.

Wherever we call home, let us remember not everyone is as fortunate as we are and we need to remember to be God's hands doing his work.
