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## Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday

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*The Sunday of the Pasion or Palm Sunday as it is usually called commences on a high note of joy and anticipation just as the Sunday before Passover began on the final week of Jesus' life. Our worship today begins with a Procession with palm branches held high to welcome the King. By the midpoint in the service, the gospel account of Jesus' passion and death is read and the mood changes. Holy Week has begun.*

### The Procession with Palms

**P: Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.**

**C: Hosanna to the Son of David.**

**P: The Lord be with you,**

**C: And also with you.**

**P: Let us pray. Mercifully assist us, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts whereby you have given us life everlasting, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen**

**We ask that you bless these branches and those who bear them, and those who bear them, and grant that we may ever hail him as our Lord and King and follow him with perfect confidence; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.**

being born in human likeness.  
And being found in human

form,  
<sup>8</sup>he humbled himself  
and became obedient to the  
point of death—  
even death on a cross.

<sup>9</sup>Therefore God also highly  
exalted him

and gave him the name  
that is above every name,

<sup>10</sup>so that at the name of Jesus  
every knee should bend,  
in heaven and on earth and

under the earth,  
<sup>11</sup>and every tongue should  
confess

that Jesus Christ is Lord,  
to the glory of God the Father.
