a lowly donkey from you.”*

*“...and the victor is he
humble, and riding on a donkey,
on a colt, the foal of a donkey,
he will cut off the chariot from
Ephraim
and the war horse from Jerusalem,
and the battle bow shall be cut off,
and he shall command peace to the

*I do not understand my own actions.

but sin that dwells within me. ¹⁸For I
know that nothing good dwells within
me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what
is right, but I cannot do it. ¹⁹For I do

not want is what I do. ²⁰Now if I do what
I do not want, it is no longer I that do it,
but sin that dwells within me.*

GOSPEL: Matthew 11:16-19, 25-30

*[Jesus spoke to the crowd saying:] “To
what will I compare this generation? It
is like children sitting in the market
places and calling to one another.*

*¹⁷“We played the flute for you,
and you did not dance,
we wailed, and you did not
mourn.”*

*¹⁸For John came neither eating nor
drinking, and they say, ‘He has a
demon’; ¹⁹the Son of Man came eat-
ing and drinking, and they say, ‘Look,
a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of
tax collectors and sinners!’ Yet wisdom
is vindicated by her deeds.”*

*²⁵At that time Jesus said, “I thank
you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth,
because you have hidden these things
from the wise and the intelligent and
have revealed them to infants; ²⁶yes,
Father, for such was your gracious will.
²⁷All things have been handed over to
me by my Father; and no one knows
the Son except the Father, and no one
knows the Father except the Son and
anyone to whom the Son chooses to re-
veal him.*
