



From the Pastor,

I was working on the Tower Echoes newsletter article on September 12 when I looked at the October calendar to find the U.S. Holidays. The first one I looked at read October 9 “Indigenous People’s Day (Columbus Day)”. My desk calendar stated “Columbus Day”. The third calendar read “Indigenous Peoples Day”. The fourth calendar stated “Indigenous Peoples Day (Columbus Day)”. Oh yeah, three agreed it was also “Thanksgiving Day (Canada)”.

Older people roll their eyes when they are corrected that October 9th is Indigenous Peoples Day and not Columbus Day. We hate change. We also don’t understand why we just can’t celebrate Columbus Day like we always did because migrants (Europeans) coming to North America was a good thing. Yes, good for many of us but at the expense of those already living on the land.

We can not change the past but we can try to understand how the past has negatively affected others and their descendants. We can try to help find ways to help others improve their lives and overcome the wrongs of the past. This is a justice issue. It is hard to change our attitude about things. Perhaps one way to view October 9th is we commemorate Columbus Day, celebrate Indigenous People Day, and say “Happy Thanksgiving” to any Canadian friends.

October 31 is Reformation Day. This is another day that I had to have my attitude checked. Former Bishop Maas reminded pastors at a Theological Conference that we celebrate it. We don’t celebrate the breach in the church. That was the last year I celebrated it and now I remember it every year. I do cheat though. I do joke that it is the one day that I am a Lutheran. The rest of the year I am a Lutheran Christian.

This was an impromptu meeting of the Women of the ELCA, Grace Lutheran church, after Worship Service on Sunday, September 3, 2023 called by President Carolyn Cropp. The purpose of this meeting was to go over information regarding the purchase of kitchen stoves.

Present at the meeting were: Carolyn Cropp, Joyce Roesener, Julie Effken, Jody Wellensiek, Eleta Eisenhauer, Charlene Helgren, Karen Cerny, Diane Ekhoft, Kate Dietz, Kris Ebeler, Gayleen Eden and Alta Bohling.

Julie Effken presented findings of a Maytag stove with a regular oven and a convection oven. The stove retailed for \$1,400.00, Home Depot had it on sale for \$950.00 and when Julie spoke with Damme Appliance they would sell it to us for \$900.00 the stove is stainless steel as there was a 6 month waiting list for this stove in white. Damme Appliance would install the stoves and remove and dispose of the old stoves.

A motion was made by Karen Cerny to purchase the stoves, in stainless steel, from Damme Appliance for \$900.00 and a second was made by Charlene Helgren. All were in favor. The stoves were delivered and installed on Friday, September 8, 2023.

September 19, 2023

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL met September 19, 2023. The meeting was called to order by President Bret Wellensiek. Pastor Helgren opened the meeting with prayer. Council members present were Bret Wellensiek, Mike Weber, Sarah Purcell, Cheryl Grundman, Pastor Jim Helgren, and church secretary/treasurer Diane Wilken. Erin Ebeler, council member, absent.

Minutes were amended to read Chris Harris, organ specialist, reported to our organists that the organ should be insured for \$150,000. Motion by Mike Weber to approve minutes as amended, second by Sarah Purcell, motion carried.

Financial report: Reviewed the account balances as of August 31, 2023. Motion by Cheryl Grundman to accept report, second by Sarah Purcell, motion carried.

Pastor's Report: September 2023; burial at Hope, worship service at Good Sam's, visits to Linden View and Richmond Senior Living. 19 students attended the first day of Kids for Christ, a meeting was held with first year confirmation parents. Grace has 3 first year confirmation students. There will be no youth from Grace attending the 2024 Youth Gathering. Pastor Helgren and Eleta Eisenhower will attend "IDEA Training". Crop Walk scheduled for October 1, 2023.

Correspondence: Thank you from Oaks Indian Mission for \$195.00 offering.

Committee Reports:

Property: Aeration and necessary seeding to church/parsonage lawns completed. One tree was replaced on the west side of the church by Mike Wiebke. A recommendation by Dave Smith and Paul Wilken to take down and replace 2 trees at the parsonage.

Worship and Fellowship: Motion by Bret Wellensiek and second by Sarah Purcell to pay \$250.00 invoice for repair of organ. Motion passed.

Parish Ed and Youth: Bret Wellensiek reported that there are two sessions of Sunday School this fall. Luther League will meet October 8, 2023.

Memorial: Motion by Sarah Purcell and second by Bret Wellensiek to use memorial funds for 2 new trees at the parsonage. Motion carried. The council approves the recommendations of the tree removal timeline, selection of new trees and planting of trees to be at the discretion of Dave Smith and Paul Wilken.

Other items of Discussion:

Mission Festival: Council will set up, women will be asked to make coffee and put center pieces on the tables. Breakfast is at 9:00 and worship is at 10:00. Grace breakfast casseroles, Hope rolls and side dishes.

75th Anniversary:

JCC will allow Grace the use of the new gym and commons area at no charge. Tables and chairs can be used from the school, the community center, and the church. Lori Panko will provide updated information of the anniversary on Facebook. Save the Date cards have been mailed. Mike Weber made a motion that the church offering go 50/50 to the Mission Field Nebraska and Osage Food Pantry, second by Sarah Purcell, motion carried. Sarah Purcell made a motion that the council with approval from the congregation offer the noon meal at no charge with a free donation available, second by Bret Wellensiek, motion carried. The meal will be prepared and catered by Ricky's Cafe. Motion by Sarah Effken to approve the budget as presented by the anniversary committee, second by Bret Wellensiek, motion carried.

When you are near or passing through the church kitchen take some time to notice our two new cook stoves. After Vacation Bible School it was reported that one of the cook stoves didn't cook the meals and that the other one burned what was to be cooked. The kitchen help was so frustrated they served cold sandwiches the last day and didn't try to deal with the stoves. It was brought to the attention of the church council and to the church women. At their July meeting the women brought along an oven thermometer and discovered that when set at 350 one stove never got out of the two hundred degree range while the other stove advanced to over four hundred degrees. Since there was recall that one stove had been repaired in the not too distant past it seemed that new stoves were in order.

With the publication of the last Tower Echoes and the advertising and launching of a new church opportunity that involved food it was realized that something needed to be done to rectify our cooking problem. A committee was appointed and they were able to research available stoves at Lincoln stores that sell appliances and took their findings to our local Damme Appliances Store and found them willing to go below quoted prices. Labor Day sales worked to our advantage.

It was decided to go with stoves that had convection settings so that if two shelves of food need to be warmed or cooked at the same time it could be. Convection was no extra cost. One of the main considerations was that anyone would be able to operate the stoves without having to consult a manual to do so.

The church women along with the church council provided funds for this purchase. Some memorial money was used. It is hoped that many meals and treats will be prepared and that good food and good fellowship will continue at Grace Lutheran.

New Business

- Women's Fall Convention will be held October 6-8, 2023 with Eleta Eisenhower and Carolyn Cropp attending. The convention's theme this year is "Be Still". The in-kind offering is ACCESS PERIOD with feminine hygiene products being requested. The various products were discussed and a motion was made by Kathy Helgren to send an in-kind offering of \$125.00 so ACCESS PERIOD could purchase the feminine hygiene products of their choosing. Second was made by Eleta Eisenhower. The regular offering to the Women's Fall Convention was discussed and a motion was made by Kathy Helgren and second by Joyce Roesener to send \$125.00. This money goes to scholarships and other programs.
