September is Serve with Neighbors Month!

Here is your challenge: Lets create quilt blocks an assemble a quilt so that we can be reminded of how beautiful a thing working together and serving with our neighbor can be.

The criteria for the block should be that it be made out of any fabrics which feature grey and/or reds. Your finished block should ideally measure 10 and 1/2 inches. (The half inch allows for the blocks to be sewn together.) You should also place your name and or initials in the right hand bottom corner of the block up at least a quarter of an inch so they don't get lost in the connecting seam line.

Let's strive to have the blocks completed and returned to church by October 15. If fabric is an issue for you there will be some pieces that can be used or pieces to supplement what you already have in the church basement. Feel free to take what you need. If this project interests you it will be just fine if you make more than one block. If you have questions contact Joyce Roesener, Karen Cerny or Eleta Eisenhauer. Our goal will be to get forty eight blocks to make a serviceable size quilt. Alta Bohling is prepared to quilt it for us. Let's see what we can do. Plain and simple will be just fine. We need your block!

Kids for Christ is an interdenominational after school program hosted by Grace Lutheran and also supported by the ladies at Osage. Kids share a snack, a devotion, a picture book story, usually a craft, some singing, prayer and an evening meal. This program has its goal to teach children that God loves them. The children come right after school and are ready to be picked up about 5:30 to 5:45. If we have more adults who wish to share time or talents they are welcome to come too. Your coming can be a onetime event, it does not have to be a commitment.

This year we are going to attempt to add some intergenerational experience to Kids for Christ. We are inviting senior citizens of our community to come share the evening meal with the kids. As we start this new venture we will not be charging for the meal. Any senior who wants to eat supper will be welcome. We do ask that seniors contact the church by noon on Monday before our Wednesday meeting so that groceries can be purchased to accommodate the group. Grace Lutheran Church Council

August 15, 2023

Grace Lutheran Church Council met on August 15, 2023. The meeting was called to order by President Bret Wellensiek. Pastor Jim Helgren started the meeting with a prayer. Council members present were Erin Ebeler, Mike Weber, and Cheryl Grundman. Sarah Purcell was absent. Also in attendance was Pastor Jim Helgren and Diane Wilken – Church Secretary/Treasurer.

Previous Month's Minutes and Treasurer's Report

Cheryl Grundman made a motion to accept the minutes of the July 6, 2023, meeting. Mike Weber seconded. Motion carried.

The financial report as of July 31, 2023 was reviewed. Erin Ebeler moved to accept the treasurer's report. Cheryl Grundman seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor's Monthly Report

Pastor gave his monthly report. Among items shared included the following:

- Past Events:
 - Reviewed past visits to members.
- Future Events:
 - Aug. 30, 2023 – Will lead worship at Linden View
 - September 2023 – Pastor will be writing the “Pulpit Reflections” for Tecumseh Chieftain
 - National Youth Gathering
As of right now, only one or two kids are interested in attending.
Students need to let Pastor know right away if they're interested in going.
Pastor is in talks with Syracuse to join with their group.
 - Crop Walk – First Sunday in October
 - Plan to continue utilizing the Nebraska Synod's “Go And...” theme.
 - * Eleta Eisenhauer is working on “Go And...” banners for the church. There is a sign-up sheet at the back of the church if members would like to assist in this process.
 - * Temple Talks by members are taking place during the month of August – the theme is “Share Your Story.” Members are sharing about significant moments in their faith (e.g., how they chose to be a member of Grace; a time when God touched their life; etc.).
 - First Week: Sarah Purcell shared on reading the Bible over the course of the year.
 - Second Week: Hayden Wellensiek spoke about Church Camp.
 - Third Week: Eleta Eisenhauer will speak.
 - Fourth Week: Nick Weber will speak.
 - September Theme: “Go And...Serve with Neighbors”
 - IDEA – Pastor and Eleta Eisenhauer will be attending a meeting designed to excite people about becoming more active in church, including in leadership positions and/or overall events and activities.

Correspondence

Bret Wellensiek reviewed correspondence, which included a letter from Oaks Indian Mission thanking Grace for its gift.

Committee Reports:

Property: There is a group that is working to re-seed the lawns in the first part of September. They're looking at replacing a couple of trees but will not be able to get information on that until next week. The window company is coming on 8-16-2023 to begin work and review the windowpanes in the front doors of the church. During the church service on 8-13-2023, Joyce reported rain coming in through the bell tower.

Pastor reported that Gene Ekhoft has repaired the step going from the house into the garage. The water heater in the parsonage wasn't working a few weeks ago (a fuse had blown), and the issue recently re-appeared. Southeast Plumbing reported that where the fuses were was quite hot. Dave Smith was able to get an electrician to come in to repair the issue. Thanks to Gene and Dave for their efforts!

Worship and Fellowship: Sarah Purcell reported that the organ should likely be insured for \$150,000. The organ is to be inspected next week. Pastor reported that Nebraska Right to Life has asked if we had anyone who wanted to help man the Pro-Life booth at the Johnson County Fair. Information is being sent to Pastor on that booth. If anyone is interested in getting involved in that group, they should contact Pastor.

Youth: Erin Ebeler reported on Vacation Bible School. Approximately 25 students (age 3 – 6th grade) attended, and more than 10 junior high/high school aged kids assisted. Eleven to twelve adults assisted each week from Grace, Hope, and Osage churches. The Kids sang at the community church service on July 16, 2023.

Kids for Christ meals were discussed as well as the potential for inviting members of the community to join the kids for suppers and/or deliver meals to members of the community. Thanks to Andrea Eggleston for her work on this effort. The first Kids for Christ meeting is September 13, 2023, and will occur on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays when school is in session.

Memorial: During Vacation Bible School, problems arose with the ovens in the basement. Cheryl Grundman moved to provide \$700 to the Grace Lutheran Women's Group for the purchase of a replacement stove. Bret Wellensiek seconded. Motion carried.

Other Items of Discussion

- 75th Anniversary Committee: Will be meeting on September 13, 2023. Save the Date cards are being sent.
- Safety deposit box keys. One key has been identified and is kept by Diane Wilken in a fire-proof safe.
- Oct. 8, 2023 – Mission Fest is scheduled for that day with Worship at 10:00 a.m. Breakfast will be served starting at 9 a.m. Grace will be responsible for providing breakfast casseroles, juice, and coffee. Hope will be requested to provide rolls and side items. People's City Mission from Lincoln will be the main speaker for that day.
- Confirmation – The first parent/student meeting is scheduled for August 30, 2023.
- Sunday School will begin the week after Labor Day. Two classes will be taught this year, breaking up the younger and older kids. Thank you to Bret & Melissa Wellensiek for providing their leadership.
- Noisy Coin will be designated for the People's City Mission through the end of October.
- Next Council Meeting will be held on September 19, 2023, at 7 pm.

The meeting was adjourned by Bret Wellensiek, and the meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
