From the Pastor,

The January theme was rest. The February theme is GO AND... HAVE THE CONVERSATION. This is the ninth theme for us as we build onto the first theme which was pray. Prayer can be restful which fits January's theme. Prayer can help us be honest. It can help us be present with God and help us be aware that God is present with us. Prayer is a building block of our faith and a necessity of our own faith life.

Conversation is more than just talking and it is more than just listening. It requires two or more people to have a conversation. And it requires these participants to be willing to listen to each other. Actively listen to each other and not think about anything else but what is being said. The art of conversation has been lost. We are trying to revive it this month. What conversation do you need to have with someone? Pray before you begin the conversation. What conversation does someone need to have with you? Pray that you are able to truly listen to the other person.

Ash Wednesday is about having a conversation with God. We admit that we are sinful and unclean and we need God to change our very nature. We receive the ash in a form of the cross on our forehead to remind us that we are dust and to dust we shall return, unless God changes our path. Lent is a time we change our path that is focused on ourselves and we focus on what we need to do in order to listen to God. Some Christians will stop doing a bad habit, some will begin a better habit, and some will give up something they enjoy in order to appreciate that Jesus gave up His life for us so we can live with God forever. Jesus reminds us that all we are is dust unless we allow the cross to change our future.

March 16, 2024 is NATIONAL QUILTING DAY, and we at Lutheran World Relief, we have a LOT to celebrate!



GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL

JANUARY 16, 2024

Grace Lutheran Church Council met on January 16, 2024. The meeting was called to order by President Bret Wellensiek. Pastor opened with prayer. Council members present were Bret Wellensiek, Mike Weber, and Cheryl Grundman. Also in attendance was Pastor Jim Helgren and Diane Wilken-church secretary/treasurer. Absent were Erin Ebeler and Sarah Purcell.

Previous Month's Minutes and Treasurer's Report

Motion by Cheryl Grundman and second by Mike to approve December 19, 2023, minutes. Motion carried.

The account balances as of December 31, 2023, were reviewed.

Motion by Mike Weber to accept Treasurer's Report, second by Cheryl Grundman. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report

1. Provided December visits.
2. Reviewed February 2024 Lenten Schedule: Ash Wednesday Feb 14 @ Hope, Feb 21 @ Grace, and Feb 28 @ Hope. Services at 7:00 PM.
3. In addition to Wednesday services, Grace will host luncheon-based services on Thursdays. The lunch will be prepared by Eleta Eisenhauer. The fellowship lunch will start at 11:30 with worship at approximately 12:10. February dates are the 15th, 22nd, and 29th. Everyone is invited, particularly senior citizens who prefer not to go out at night.
4. February is donation of Socks, Undies, Gloves/Mittens in all sizes for the People City Mission. A basket will be available every Sunday in February for the collection of these items.
5. Grand View University, Des Moines IA will host a cost-free training program, FAITH FORWARD-FAMILIES PASSING FAITH ON. Pastor will attend the program April 29 - 30, 2024. The cost for Grace will be mileage and lodging. Pastor will present the program to Grace after we have celebrated our 75th anniversary in June.
6. Church cancellation due to blizzard conditions will be open for discussion at the annual meeting.

The next meeting is February 19, 2024.

January 21, 2024

President Bret Wellensiek called the meeting to order on January 21, 2024, following worship service. There were 27 members in attendance. The meeting was opened with a prayer led by Pastor Helgren.

- During 2024, the “GO AND...” series will continue, and Grace will continue to participate.
- Pastor discussed our continued use of social media to present church services simultaneously with live attendance. He noted that we encourage/allow at-home viewers to prayerfully engage in communion while watching church services regardless of whether done on Sunday morning or while watching service three days later at a time that works in the viewer’s schedule.
- Lenten lunches will be hosted at Grace Lutheran on Thursdays. He will present his sermon from the Wednesday night before. Hope Lutheran is invited to attend the lunches, as are all members of the community.

Bret Wellensiek reviewed the statistical report and presented his President’s Report.

The Treasurer’s Report, Benevolence Giving Report, and Budget Report were reviewed. Questions were asked and answered.

A discussion and vote were held on the number of Council Members. Paul Wilken moved to keep the number of Council Members at 5. Gene Ekhoff seconded. Motion carried.

Bret thanked the council members whose service had ended, Erin Ebeler & Mike Weber.

Cheryl Grundman agreed to serve for another one-year term.

Jody Wellensiek agreed to serve one of the two-year terms.

One 2 year term remains open at this time. It will be announced at next church service and members are encouraged to volunteer.

Diane Wilken moved to cease nominations. Karen Cerny seconded. Motion carried.

Paul and Diane Wilken volunteered to serve as delegates to the Nebraska Synod Assembly (June 1-2) at the Younes Center in Kearney, NE. Julie Effken moved to close nominations. Jody Wellensiek seconded. Motion carried.

Rich and Joyce Roesener were elected as financial secretaries.

Melissa Wellensiek was elected as Sunday School Superintendent.

Roster of electees was approved by acclamation.

The proposed budget for 2024 was discussed. Questions were asked and answered. Julie Effken moved to approve the 2024 budget. Karen Cerny seconded. Motion carried.

Discussion was held about future weather-based cancelations. If congregation members have suggestions on how to better communicate those in the future, they're encouraged to bring those to a Council member.

Paul Wilken moved to close the meeting. Gene Ekhoff seconded.

Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
