From the Pastor,

I sometimes find it challenging to find inspiration to write this article because I have to write about the upcoming month while still focused on the worship and projects of the month I am still in.

I need to write “Christ Is Risen! Alleluia!” But it is Holy Week and our tradition avoids exclaiming Alleluia during the worship. My Palm Sunday sermon was sort of upbeat, but my Passion Sunday sermon did not end very upbeat. I ended with the question, “What kind of father is God to just stand by and watch His Son die such a painful death?”

The answer to that question took a whole week to answer. The answer came March 31 when the Church gathers to exclaim “CHRIST IS RISEN! ALLELUIA!!” Holy week is even more of a downer than is penitential Lent. We move from Palm Sunday towards a funeral. Does anyone really enjoy a funeral? Even when people try to put the fun back into funeral by calling it a celebration of life service or ceremony, does anyone really look forward to attending? Death is death. Gone is gone.

God gives the funeral a different meaning. God declares Easter morning that everyone was wrong about their vision of Jesus. He is God’s Son and He had to die in order to live. Jesus had to be raised from the dead in order to conquer your sin, your death, and the power of the devil over you. Easter celebrates God claiming you as His own. Now this Easter season will you claim your place in God’s Kingdom given to you through the actions of God the Father through Jesus.

If so, then exclaim **“JESUS CHRIST IS RISEN INDEED!!”**

75th Anniversary Celebration Meal



2. At the 75th Anniversary Celebration, there will be a freewill donation box by the picture display board(s), on which there will be an eloquently written statement regarding donations. Any donations will go for expenses related to the 75th Anniversary Celebration, including the meal. Any remaining donations will be placed in the General Fund of Grace Lutheran Church.
3. The offering accepted during the worship service was previously designed to be divided evenly between the ELCA's Mission Field Nebraska and the Osage Food Pantry.

This was approved at the February 20th Grace Lutheran Church Council meeting.

Minutes of February meeting were reviewed. Cheryl Grundman moved to accept the minutes as presented, Bret Wellensiek 2nd. Minutes approved.

Treasurer's report reviewed. Cheryl Grundman motioned to accept the Treasurer's report, 2nd by Bret Wellensiek. Motion carried.

Sarah Purcell arrived at 7:20.

Pastor's report.

1. Provided February contacts - sick/communion visits and phone calls with shut in's.
2. First communion instruction started, with 1st communion to be on Maundy Thursday for Sheridan Thompson and Charlotte Wellensiek.
3. Liturgy and the Natural World will be offered on Wednesday evenings in April starting on 4/10/24 at 7 pm. Training is at no-cost, offered through Lutheran School of Theology.
4. There is a Middle School Gathering at Sheridan Lutheran in Lincoln on 4/13/24. Pastor will try to attend with any youth interested.
5. Boundary training for Pastors and PMA's is scheduled.
6. Thursday Lenten Lunches at Grace have been well attended with 10 – 13 each day.
7. Jean Effken's funeral was 3/9/24. Funeral scheduled at Burr on 3/30/24.
8. Kids for Christ will be held on 3/27/24.
9. Synod training with Bishop scheduled of 3/19/24 in Adams.
10. World Day of Prayer was observed at Hope on 3/1/24.
