75th Anniversary Celebration

All the glory to God for giving us a wonderful day to celebrate the ministry of the Gospel at Grace Lutheran Church. A warm thank you to each of you for doing your part to make the celebration a tremendous success. Many hands make a light load.

The morning began with renewing friendships, eating a variety of delicious pastries, and enjoying coffee on the east parking lot. A memento of the celebration included a photo of Grace Lutheran with a cross pendant. A variety of musical selections were sung during this time by Alberta Block, Sharon Carman, and Kathy Hackstadt, members of the group *Grace Notes*. Amazingly the morning temperature was comfortable with no wind! God's presence was surely in this place!

We welcomed 255 people from several generations to our worship service. Nebraska Synod ELCA Bishop Scott Johnson offered a powerful sermon and John Weber provided amazing organ music. A special adult choir provided three musical selections, while the children's handbell choir played "Amazing Grace." 2 new banners were made for the celebration by Shelley Moles.

The offering gifts of \$3,481.00 will be divided equally between the ELCA's Mission Field Nebraska and the Osage Food Pantry.

We were thrilled to receive two beautiful flower arrangements and a potted plant from local churches. The card from Faith Lutheran Church in Talmage read "May the love of God continue to guide and inspire you as you celebrate this special anniversary!" The message from Hope Lutheran in Burr stated "Congrats on your 75th Anniversary!" The card from Luther Memorial in Syracuse was signed "We thank God for our brothers and sisters in Christ at Grace Lutheran and their special anniversary." Letters from Pastor Roger Hoffman and Sandy Olson were received and are included in this month's Tower Echoes.

Artist Kris Seeba Wellsandt, who was confirmed in 1973, created a painting of Grace Lutheran entitled "Easter Sun Rise." She gifted the framed artwork to the church which included this note:

"Congratulation on 75 years! I feel so blessed to have had Grace as a part of my early church family. I wish all the past generations of friends and family could be here today – mom and dad (Glen and Izma Seeba), Grandma Seeba (Lena Seeba), Aunt Emma (Emma Ocker). All the people were so instrumental in shaping my life and teaching me about faith.

One of my favorite memories of the church was the outside Easter Sunrise Services and special music (my brothers Russ and John Seeba playing trumpets). What a feeling to see the sun rise and spread its warmth and light – reminding us of God's wonderful gift of salvation and love.

May the spirit of Grace Lutheran continue to shine bright in the world! Happy Anniversary to the wonderful members! Thank you for including me in your celebration!"



Following the worship service, a drone photo of attendees was taken on the front church steps and lawn. The group then made their way to the JCC Middle School for a delicious buffet meal served by Ricky's Café from Hano-ver, Kansas. For dessert, we enjoyed cupcakes baked and decorated by Penny Weber. Special touches in the gym included centerpieces that were miniature replicas of Grace Lutheran Church and quilts created by the Piecemakers. A donation box at the school collected \$570.00 to add to the previously collected amount of \$3,560.00 for a total of \$4,130.00. Ricky's Café was paid \$2,880.50 – 241 adult meals at \$9.50 each, 14 youth meals at \$6.50 each, with the remainder a tip. Grace Lutheran, as a church did not have to pay the Kansas tax. The two porta potties were \$95 a piece with a \$45 delivery/pickup charge for a total of \$235.00. We received three Thrivent cards to help offset other expenses. The remaining dollars will go into the church's general fund. We thank everyone who helped support the 75th Anniversary Celebration through contributions of time, talents, and resources.
