Followers of Jesus begin to leave Jesus when he insists that one must eat his body and drink his blood in order to have eternal life. Many are offended and walk away from Jesus, yet he never stops insisting that he abides in us when we consume his body and blood.

John and Jesus of course are talking about Holy Communion. Jesus gives us his body and blood through bread and wine (juice, water). Jesus calls us to do this often in remembrance of his life, death, resurrection and ascension. Do this for the forgiveness of sins. Wow, what a true comfort food. A comfort food for the soul. A chance to eat and drink for forgiveness of sins. Taste forgiveness. Taste that the Lord is good to you.

The church is the only institution that provides this comfort food. Need to feel close to God, eat and drink Christ. Need to feel forgiveness, eat and drink Christ. Need to know that you are special and important to God, eat and drink Christ. Why do we attend church? Because Jesus said he abides in you when you eat his flesh and drink his blood. The only place set up to help us achieve that is the church, His body. Jesus the bread of life is my soul food staple.
