



We have Cultivated love, Cultivated love through re-creation, and this month, September, we Cultivate Love through New _____. Take a change on doing a new God thing. Try using a different prayer tool. Try varying your prayer time. Try visiting with person new to you. Add a new way of serving God. Read scriptures as prayer or just read scripture if that is new. Stay silent for thirty seconds and listen for the Holy Spirit to speak to you during your waking hours.

We can cultivate love through new questions, new ideas, and new dreams and imaginations. Sometimes to move forward in our lives and/or our faith we need the Holy Spirit to challenge us to do something new or different. I officially hate change yet I understand that the cross changes everything. So maybe I can embrace change (sometimes). Have fun challenging yourself this month to cultivating love through a new challenge.

Welcome back to “Kids for Christ!” Again this year we will meet the second Wednesday and the fourth Wednesdays after school on the days that school is in attendance. To adapt to the school schedule change we will meet from 4 until 6.

Our routine usually will be a snack, devotions, a story, and singing, a craft and closing prayer followed by an evening meal. Our purpose is to help young ones grow in faith and reinforce that God loves them. All school age children are welcome. Pastor meets the school bus and children depart in front of the church so young ones don't have to cross a street.

Hope to see you at the church basement on September 11. It will be very helpful if the child brings the name and number of an emergency contact person for us to have on file. Older students will again have the opportunity for Community Service by helping prepare the evening meal.

We invite interested community persons to join us about 5:30 to share our evening meal. Call the church 402-864-4201 by Tuesday noon so we can have enough food prepared.

ELCW Saved to Serve

The Saved to Service in gathering for the Dana Village was tremendous. It would not have been possible without all of you. Over one hundred thirty quilts were donated. About half of them tied and half quilted. The young people were allowed to pick one of each. Shelves were assembled and placed in three or four store rooms and they were FILLED! Everything from stool plungers, to sets of dishes or from soaps to pots and pans. For example we took 3 van loads, floor to ceiling including the passenger seat of just toilet paper to the shelves.

This is a new program for Lutheran Family and Social Services so it is going to continue to need our prayers. Part of their grant money has been used to purchase a large van for making transportation to jobs available. Young people are expected to pay at least four hundred fifty dollars as month toward their rent plus utilities and communication service so a job is a necessity. The first resident of the program received training through Job Core. The young people we met were very appreciative and glad to be there.

We learned of "Youth Mart" a donation center that serves former foster care youth ages 16-24. They are allowed to shop free of charge for household essentials. The public can donate household essentials, furniture and personal care items. It is operated by Partnership 4 Hope on the Omaha Home for Boys Campus, 5111 Sprague Plaza, Omaha, NE 68104, Phone 531-389-7551 and the email is youthmart.p4h@gmail.com. A volunteer truck brigade does some pick up and does deliver to the youth (The Dana Village Youth have been getting their bedroom furniture there.) youthmart@Omahahomeforboys.org for opportunities to donate.

Those of us who attended the Dana Village "Saved to Serve" weekend came away feeling like we had helped make a difference in the lives of others, we had shared with friends while making some new ones. And had the opportunity to praise and thank our Lord. Your donations helped make this weekend the success that it was. We are passing along thanks to you from the youth, the weekend planning committee and Lutheran Family and Social Services. All were amazed and oh so thankful. Again, know your generosity was very much appreciated.

New Business:


Mission Festival is scheduled at Hope on 10/13/24 at 10 am with Martin Malley as guest speaker. Members of Grace are to provide salad and desserts.
