Every Veteran's Day my wife texts a "Happy Veteran's Day" greeting to my son serving in the Army Reserve. Grace Lutheran Cemetery.



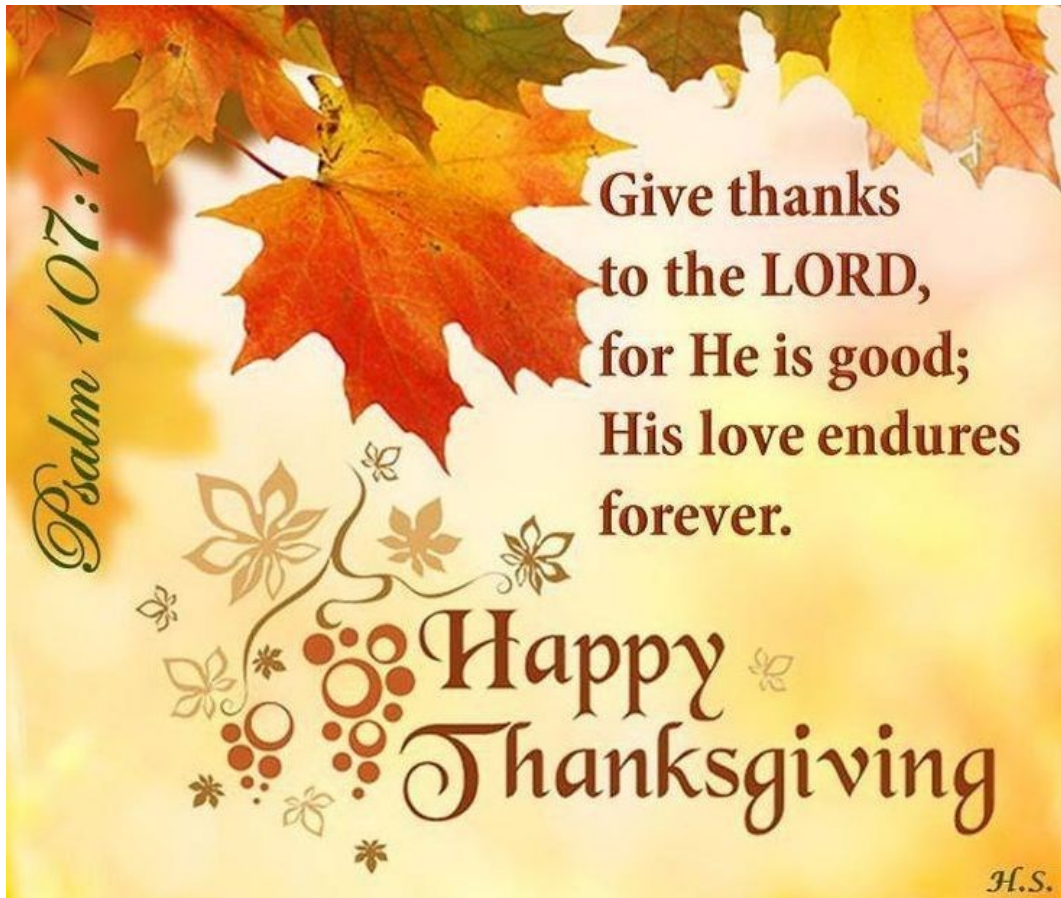

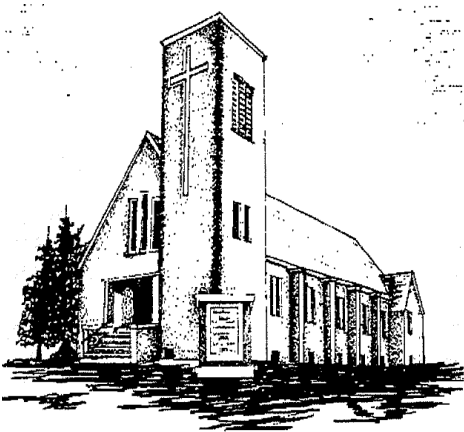
