Processional Gospel

Luke 19:28-40

After he had said this, [Jesus] went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.

²⁹When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, ³⁰saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³¹If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it.'" ³²So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. ³³As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" ³⁴They said, "The Lord needs it." ³⁵Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. ³⁶As

he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. ³⁷As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, ³⁸saying,

"Blessed is the king
who comes in the name of the
Lord!

Peace in heaven,
and glory in the highest heaven!"

³⁹Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." ⁴⁰He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."

The Lord GOD has given me

⁵The Lord GOD has opened my ear,
and I was not rebellious,
I did not turn backward.

⁶I gave my back to those who struck me,
and my cheeks to those who pulled
out the beard;

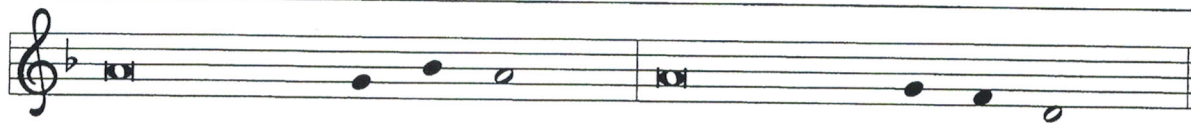
I did not hide my face

⁷The Lord GOD helps me;
therefore I have not been disgraced;
therefore I have set my face like flint,
and I know that I shall not be put to

Let them confront me.

⁹It is the Lord GOD who helps me;
who will declare me guilty?



Have mercy on me, O LORD,
for I ¹ am in trouble;
my eye is consumed with sorrow,
and also my throat ¹ and my belly.

¹⁰ **For my life is wasted with grief,
and my ¹ years with sighing;
my strength fails me
because of affliction,
and my bones ¹ are consumed.**

¹¹ I am the scorn of all my enemies,
a disgrace to my neighbors,
a dismay to ¹ my acquaintances;
when they see me in the street
¹ they avoid me.

¹² **Like the dead I am forgotten,
¹ out of mind;
I am as useless as a ¹ broken pot.**

¹³ For I have heard
the whispering of the crowd;
fear is ¹ all around;
they put their heads together
against me;
they plot to ¹ take my life.

¹⁴ **But as for me,
I have trusted in ¹ you, O LORD.
I have said, "You ¹ are my God.**

¹⁵ My times are ¹ in your hand;
rescue me
from the hand of my enemies,
and from those who ¹ persecute me.

¹⁶ **Let your face shine
up- ¹ on your servant;
save me in your ¹ steadfast love."**
