Hope Lutheran Church Annual Meeting Minutes January 26, 2025

Pastor Helgren opened the meeting with prayer.

President Dave Antholz called the business meeting to order. He asked if everyone had a chance to review the reports in the annual reports. He asked if there were any questions on the reports. None arose so he asked for a motion to accept the reports as printed. Marilyn Moss made the motion and Janice Beethe seconded. Motion passed.

Old Business: The parsonage and garage were moved. Dave Antholz filled in the hole and smoothed off the grounds. Bill Volkmer has volunteered to do the seeding for us. We will need to supply the seed. We will also need to replace some of the sidewalk which was broken up by the heavy machinery. Some of the trees were removed also and a few of the stumps need to be ground off yet.

Dave Antholz and Duane Wilken put the trim up on the church this past year.

New Business: Outgoing offices for church council are Chairman, Dave Antholz, Financial Secretary, Janice Beethe, and Deacon, Keith Moss. No nominations were made for chairman or financial secretary. Dave and Janice agreed to stay on in those positions. Mark Rumery volunteered to serve as deacon. Chairman Antholz asked for a vote of acclamation to accept these people in the positions; it passed. A round of applause was given for them.

Nebraska Synod Assembly will be May 30th and June 1st. Two delegates are needed to attend with Pastor Helgren. No volunteers at this time.

The 2025 budget was increased nearly \$5000 due mostly to a large increase for the insurance on the church building. Pastor was given a 4% increase in salary. No questions or concerns arose over the budget. Trevor Pope made a motion to accept the budget as printed. Becky Rumery seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Chairman Antholz reported that for 2024 \$16,000 was moved from savings to keep the church running.

Keith and Deb Moss have agreed to mow the grass again for 2025.

Pastor spoke about his retirement in 2026 his last official day will be the first of September but he will plan to take vacation in August. His last day in the pulpit will be the last Sunday in May. We cannot have a call committee until pastor actually leaves but we can have a "Homework Committee" which comes with a book to follow. This group will plan to meet once a month for seven months to complete the book. Then we would meet with the Homework Committee from Grace to mesh together the needs and desires we have for a new pastor to serve both churches. Pastor mentioned that Grace has begun using their cranberry hymnals this past year. This could be an issue for a new pastor coming in needing to use the two hymnals.

Alberta Block asked for a round of applause for the church council.

As there was no other business Trevor Pope motioned to adjourn the meeting seconded by Janice Beethe. Motion carried.

Pastor Helgren installed the officers.
